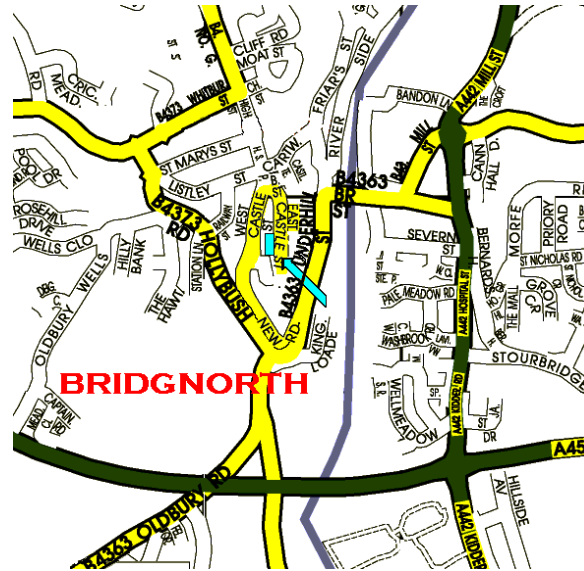
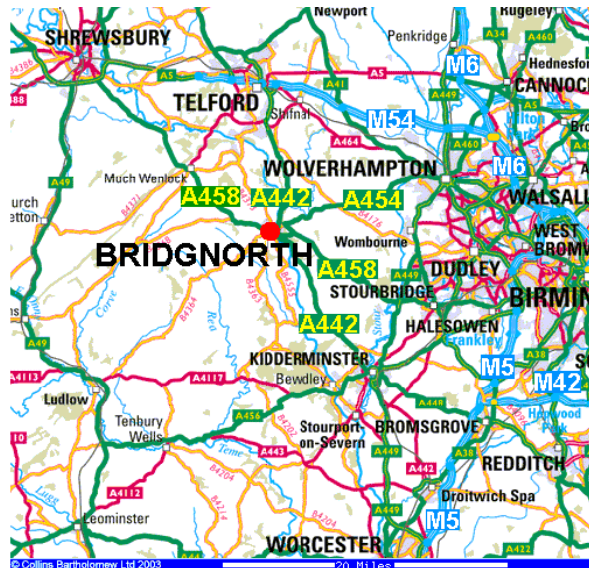


BRIDGNORTH ... AND THE SURROUNDING AREA

In the county of Shropshire in the Heart of England, Bridgnorth, busy with its bustling Saturday street market, beckons the visitor. Just a short walk from its High Street, dominated by the stilted Town Hall, are the crazily leaning castle ruins, and down below, the Severn, longest river in all our land. Surrounding the area are country parks, great houses, the splendid Border country of the Long Mynd, Wenlock Edge, the Ironbridge World Heritage site, a plethora of museums and picturesque Shropshire villages.

How about sampling our local attractions? The Severn Valley Railway or the Aircraft and Missile Museum at RAF Cosford will give you plenty to do. Or if you prefer something a little smaller, then historic Daniel's Mill or Rays Farm with its owls, wildlife and woodland walks could be made for you. Golf, horseriding and river walks abound. Or travel just a few miles to the beautiful ruins of Wenlock Priory, which lie in the heart of the small market town of Much Wenlock. Or the Industrial Heritage site at nearby Ironbridge with its working museums.

Literary buffs and lovers of a short stroll should explore the area, described by P.G. Wodehouse as "the most beautiful spot in a county noted for its fine scenery". Bridgnorth, Worfield, Shifnal and Apley Park (Castle Blandings) all appear thinly disguised in the Blandings stories, and are well worth a visit.



HOW TO FIND US...

From the North (A442)

As you approach the town you will arrive at a roundabout (A454 Wolverhampton road junction) with the Bandon Arms on the right. Go straight on over the roundabout but take the right hand lane. Turn first right at The Fox (after the Esso garage) into the one-way system and carry straight on over the bridge...

From the South (A442)

At Bridgnorth, carry straight on over A442/A458 roundabout and take 3rd left into St John Street (just before The Fox Inn on your right), and carry straight on over the bridge...

...Then:

Follow the road round to the left past the caves on your right, and take the right fork (New Road) up the side of the cliff opposite Lasyard House. Continue up the hill, passing Blunts Shoes on left (West Castle Street). Turn right just after the White Lion pub, at the cream building housing "Legends" Cantonese restaurant, into East Castle Street. East Castle Street is a cul-de-sac with no through traffic.

Just before the green-domed St Mary's church, we are at the top end of the street on the right hand side. Park by the Churchdown House garage (No 14) just past the house.
