On Wednesday, it will be the 250<sup>th</sup> Birthday of William Carey, a man who challenged the thinking of many devout Christians and was instrumental in the setting up of the Baptist Missionary Society. Of course, throughout the history of the church, many people have

gone on mission in all kinds of ways, but in 18<sup>th</sup> Century Britain, where Carey served as Pastor of a Baptist church, working as a cobbler to support himself and his family, the idea of overseas mission just didn't occur to anyone. Many churches were small and struggling, although there was a considerable degree of freedom to preach the gospel and in some places there had been remarkable success. Our Baptist forefathers in those days were particularly impressed by the doctrine of the Sovereignty of God and sometimes inclined towards the view that if God wanted to do something he would do it all alone, without any help from us. William Carey believed in the sovereignty of God, but he also understood that where there was a clear command in the Bible, Christians were required to take it seriously and act in obedience. For a number of years, the growing British Empire had been sending people to India for the purpose of trade. Carey could not understand why Christians should not be part of that movement, not to trade, but to preach the gospel, make disciples and plant churches. Like many servants of God before and since, he had the difficult task of convincing his Christian friends. But he did succeed, and the Baptist Missionary Society was formed, with Carey as one of the first missionaries to be sent out. His idea came just at the right time, and was in the forefront of a movement that has been, and still is, reaching the world for Christ.
