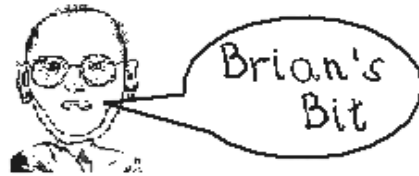

The events of Palm Sunday, as described in all four Gospels, would seem like the time when Jesus was at his most popular and his ministry was showing the greatest evidence of success. The crowds were overwhelming, his supporters were jubilant and his enemies were very much afraid. Yet for us the day has a different significance. It is evidence that the ministry of Jesus was reaching its climax, not so much in ever increasing popularity, but in fulfilment of the will of God, which would involve betrayal, desertion, rejection, condemnation and ultimately crucifixion. Some of the traditional hymns written about Palm Sunday capture the poignant scene, not just with triumphant words, like *"All glory praise and honour to you Redeemer King"* and *"Ride on, ride on in majesty"* but also with the subdued, almost mournful tone of some of the words and music. Yes, for us Easter is a joyful time, but our joy is found not so much in the acclamation on Palm Sunday as in the glorious reality of Easter Day when the whole story (almost) has been told. So we can join in the joyful celebration of Palm Sunday because we know how the story ended. Without that knowledge, we would at least be kept in suspense. For me, that kind of ambivalent attitude is entirely appropriate. We relive the pressure, the conflict and the abuse Jesus suffered, yet all the time we know how it ended and so we can rejoice. Let me wish you God's richest blessing at Eastertime and in the future.
