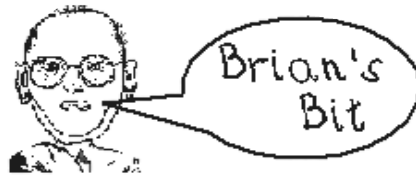

Once again, the church calendar has come round to Trinity Sunday, and once again I have decided to make this the theme of both services. The doctrine of the Trinity can be quite difficult to understand and explain, but it does lie right at the heart of our Christian faith – in fact, it is the main thing that distinguishes orthodox Christianity from many other religions and cults. Like a number of things that we celebrate in church, the Trinity is much easier to sing about and pray about than to explain! But today, I will be attempting to say something meaningful and helpful about this aspect of Christian belief. Of course, this year the same day also turns out to be Fathers' Day and I intend to include this in our worship, so I hope the two themes will be able to co-exist and hopefully to complement each other. As I said before, Trinity really does bring us to the end of the long succession of events in the Christian calendar, so much so that in my trusty Tewkesbury Abbey diary the next 18 Sundays are just called by their number after Trinity. Following the 18th Sunday after Trinity, the next one is called "4th Sunday before Advent", which all goes to prove my point. I don't believe in following the church calendar slavishly, although I have to admit that it can be extremely helpful in planning and preparing to lead worship. But don't worry, you won't come to church one day and find me leading a meditation on the significance of the 9th Sunday after Trinity! Next week, I plan to start a series of Sunday morning messages on the Fruit of the Spirit, as found in Galatians 5 and, in the evenings I intend to preach about the life of Moses. We'll see how we get on with those

themes, but I imagine they'll take us on well into the Summer.

News Around The Pews

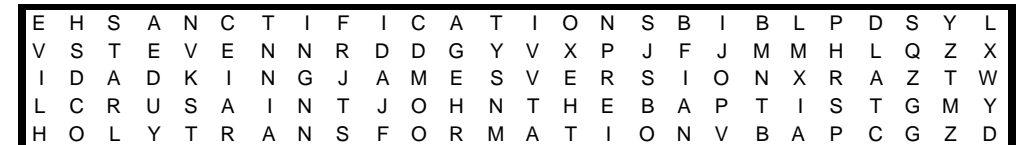
