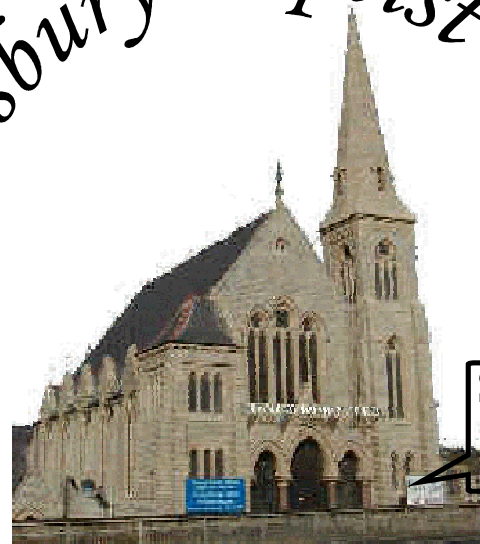

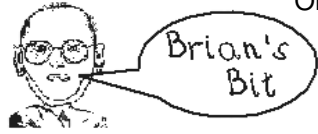

One thing that is sure to get people talking is the subject of change. Change

affects our lives, and the way we respond to it depends a lot on our personality. Many people naturally dislike change and resist it at every opportunity. Others welcome it and can't have enough. For much of the time, many of us endure it, not sure whether it will be a good thing or not. Most change happens fairly gradually, and it's only when we look at old photographs that we realise how different things have become. Some change, of course happens very suddenly. But, whatever we think about change, we will not be able to avoid it. Staying just the way we are permanently is not an option. The Bible is full of stories about change. The history of the people of Israel saw them move from Palestine to Egypt, then back again, with all the drama of the Exodus. Later, after they had lived in their own land for many years they had to face the drastic change of defeat and exile, followed eventually by the opportunity to return. The New Testament takes up the theme of change, making it clear that the coming of Jesus into the world meant that everyone should repent of their sin (repent is another word for change) and turn to God for forgiveness. Paul wrote in 2 Corinthians 5:17, "Therefore if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; the old has gone, the new has come." The change we experience in our lives will sometimes be welcome and sometimes not, but the change that Jesus brings to those who trust in him is always good, both for ourselves and for the people we meet.
