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WHAT IS THE MISC ?

The Murrayfield Ice Skating Club is a skating club which has taken an active part in all levels of ice skating since it was founded in 1957. As well as encouraging competitive skating by organising and running competitions the club helps non skaters by running group tuition classes.,

The Club sessions are on Sundays from 10.15am to 12.00pm. During this time you can learn to skate and dance. Many of the "Older" Club members will be only too willing to give you some assistance - all you need to do is ask. As well as the General skating periods there are two 15 minute dance intervals which you can either participate in or have a rest and watch. Where as it is recommended that you have some level of skating ability (e.g. grade test or UK skate level) the club is keen to encourage all levels of skating and is particularly keen to encourage family participation at all levels.

CAN I TRY BEFORE I JOIN ?

YES you can come and skate at the Club up to four times and pay just the same as Club members. Even after that you do not need to join but you will have to pay more to skate at the Club (as soon as your application form has been handed in you pay the same as Club members). At the start of the Club session there is some group tuition for beginners taken by one of the rinks coaches on behalf of the Club. This is for between 15min - 30 minutes depending on other activities the Club is running.

WHAT TYPE OF MEMBERSHIPS ARE THERE ?

Basically there are two membership categories Skating and Non Skating and these are further split depending on age or frequency of attendance.

SKATING

FULL, Under 16 and Student

If you want to skate at the club, compete in the club competitions or skate under the Clubs name in open Competitions you need to be a skating member. The two main types of skating membership are FULL and Under 16. The basic difference is that the under 16's have a lower membership fee and weekly entry to club sessions and are not able to vote at Club meetings.

Associate Skating (visitor). This category of membership to cater for members who live further away and cannot manage to attend the Club sessions very often and **do not skate at MIR** on a regular basis. Associate Skating members can attend **up to 5 club sessions** at the member price before either paying the guest rate or upgrading their membership category by paying the difference between the Associate Skater fees & the Full or Junior membership fees. NB the Associate skating member is entitled to many (but not all) skating benefits as other skating members get (e.g. skating for the Club, entry to competitions) but without the voting rights that full membership get.

NON SKATING

Recreational The Recreational member is a NON Skating member of the Club who is interest in promoting the Club and actively helps at Club sessions (doing the NON Skating work) on a regular basis. The active Recreational members have the same benefits as Full members.

Associate The Associate members are non skating members who like to spectate and be part of an organised group or like attending the various social outings the Club organises. (Associates also pay less for spectating at Club sessions).Ideal for parent or guardians.

All categories of membership are kept up to date of the Clubs Competitions, social events and benefit to reduced entry to Club run skating events. Note only Full & Recreational members are able to vote at General Meetings

The Club encourages parents or an adult guardians to attend the club sessions if the skating child is under 10years of age. To reduce the cost each week it is recommended the parent/guardian joins as an associate member and waves the joining free.

HOW DO I JOIN ?

Well its quite easy. Simply complete the details on the reverse of this form, ask 2 FULL members of the Club (16 years of age & over) to propose and second your application form and return the form in a sealed envelope to ;-

If you post your application please do not send cash in the post. You can also put the envelope in our membership box on a Sunday (beside the notice boards) Or hand it in at the box office.

All new members must pay a one off joining fee of £3.00 in addition to the membership fee. This is also payable by members who have failed to pay by the due date (31st October). Cheques should be made payable to MISC. Please do not send cash in the post.

The Club season runs from October to September each year irrespective of when you join. Using this form to join will take your membership up to September 2011.

If you want to know more about the Club we will be happy to answer all your questions at any Club session.

When 4 or more family members (at the same address) join the club the least expensive of the membership is free.
