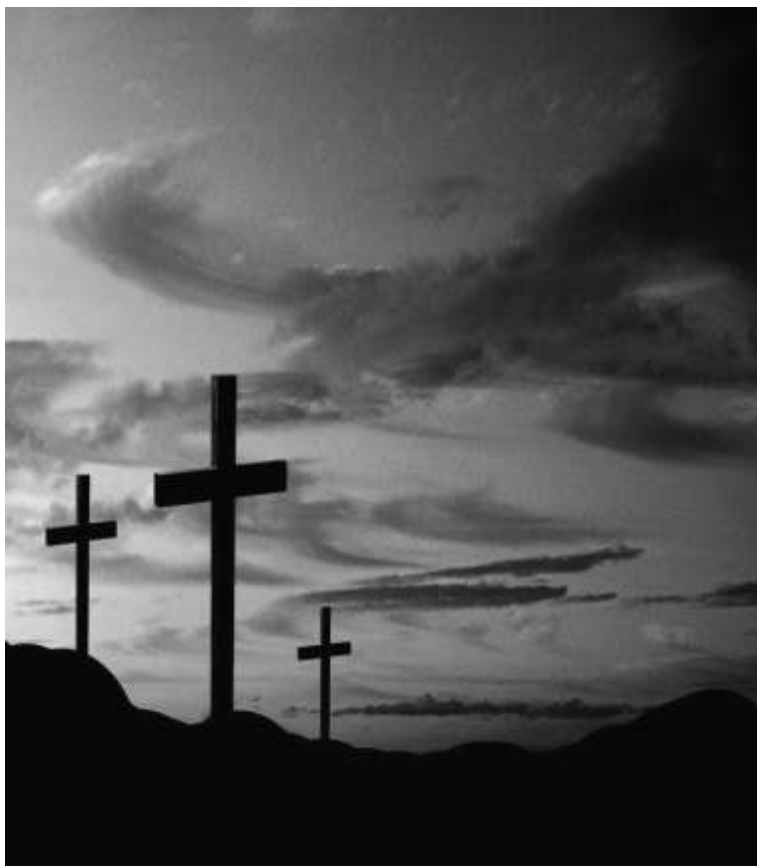

**REV'D BEVERLEY'S FAREWELL SERMON PREACHED ON 18th MARCH 2012
AT ST JOHN'S, UPPER NORWOOD**

Some years ago, I recall going to a friend's licensing as priest of St John the Divine, Kennington. I remember walking up the path into this very lofty and awesome church and offering some words to God: "Lord, you'll never catch me in a church like this!"

A little over 7 years ago, I came and visited this church, with my good friend and colleague, Alan Vousden. As we turned the corner on Auckland Road and we saw this lofty Church, I recall saying "Keep driving, we're going to have lunch instead!" Alan insisted that since we had come this far we would go inside, and as we walked through the main door .Alan went straight over to take a closer look at the cracks on the south side of the building, whilst I climbed up the step to the font.

One of the roles of the priest is a kind of midwife –birthing new Christians in the waters of Baptism. I don't know whether you've taken a look at the font – if you get a chance, take a look at the wonderful bas relief of Jesus with the little children gathered around him. And of course, if you know your Scripture, you will hear the words, "Let the little children come to me. Do not stop them!"

This is a wonderful motif and a great motto for every church .. "Don't turn the children away!" It seemed to speak to the depth of my being!

From the baptistry, my eyes were drawn to the altar, where I saw myself elevating the Bread ... the Presence ... the most precious gift of Jesus to his people ... his gift of 'self'. As my eyes followed the elevated host, I could hear the angels chorus and I was drawn to the wonderful heavenly scene in the stained glass window above. And I was caught up in the heavens, listening to two competing voices: the first was saying "feed my people, tend my people, nurture my people"! The other was imploring me to "take a look at the cracks".

The first voice won the day!

I have tried my utmost to remain faithful to God's calling, which at times has felt daunting and overwhelming.

For some, I have clearly got things wrong and it would seem that I have been an obstacle to faith. For this, I pray your forgiveness.

Throughout these past years, I have listened to amazing stories of faith, hope and love. I have shared the joys of new birth with parents and watched children grow and develop into beautiful young people.

St. John's has the best youth group...ever – I would love to snaffle you up and

take you, with your Youth Leader with me! I am so very proud of you. It is a real possibility that a link may be forged between the two parishes of St. John's Upper Norwood and All Saints Bingley.. and certainly when Endurance do their national tour, Bingley will be very happy to host you!

I have prayed with and for all kinds of people in all kinds of situations; I have sat with people in the quiet place and in the commotion of hospitals and I have watched and waited with people at their passing. We have broken bread and shared fellowship. I have never ceased to be amazed and humbled by the support of people inside and 'outside' the church both in terms of time, energy, commitment, good will and giving.

I've received tremendous support and collegiality from 2nd Croydon Scouts, from the schools, our local councillors and politicians, the Safer Neighbourhood Team, the police and numerous other people and groups.

For some of us, it feels like we have come a long way together. As your priest, I have wept with you and laughed with you ... we have shared our sorrows and our joys. You have supported me through dark and difficult times – and I pray that I have been some support to you. I have a treasure trove of memories.

It is an immense privilege to serve God as his priest ... I haven't met a priest who ever feels truly adequate for this office ... and one's flaws and weaknesses very quickly surface ... this being so, it has been an immense privilege to serve God as priest of this church and community.

The mantle that I received, I now lay down. For it has the name of another upon it ... a priest who will love you and serve you ... who you will love ... a name that only God knows at this moment, though maybe he is giving that person an inkling.

The vacancy offers you a wonderful opportunity to, in a sense, take the stabilizers off! To pull together and to worship and work together. St. John's is blessed with two excellent churchwardens, Bob & Val. I would like to thank Bob and Val for working with me so closely, effectively and lovingly. For the tremendous support you have given me and this ministry and for all we have achieved together. Please love them. Pray for them. Help and support them.

When I was appointed vicar of St. John's, the Bishop spoke to the then churchwardens, Bob Brown and John Stephens about some of the challenges that would face a single female work-focussed priest and he gave to them the duty of care. And I would like to thank you for exacting that care and for your friendship.

I did eventually take a look at those cracks ... and I learnt about the effects of

clay volatility ... and structural monitoring and redevelopment schemes ... this wasn't nearly as daunting as it would have been without the expertise of Bob Brown.

I wasn't long in the parish when Margaret and John realised I had been skipping meals. Concerned for me, they insisted that I would have "at least one decent meal a week" and they have remained faithful to this promise ... even to the extent of catering for St. James' preferred tastes!

During the discernment process for this job, I asked John Stephens if he was really up for the kind of changes that my appointment would bring. John took a deep breath and said "Yes"! And from that moment, he has rolled up his sleeves and stood shoulder to shoulder with me. Just in case you forget me too quickly, or you feel you can sit back ... I have a little something for you. *(John was then presented with a bag containing a Santa Claus outfit.)*

Just before I was licensed to this parish – netting was erected to catch falling debris! There's a metaphor there – I'm sorry to say that netting is still there and we have more cracks!

This church faces structural and hefty financial challenges that many other churches are not saddled with. It is very easy to become distracted by this ... and by the very beauty that Loughborough Pearson intended to draw us to worship.

My prayer is that as you continue to face these challenges, you do so together. And that you never lose sight of what church is really about. This is a place where people, adults and children of any age, can come, just as they are, and enquire and search and find the God who makes himself present to us; who, through grace, transforms our lives, our situations and circumstances. Who, through grace, enables us to see a little clearer; to grasp a little fuller and to love a little deeper.

The Gospel tells us, "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son. The Son did not let anything or anyone get in the way of revealing God's love for the world.

Don't let anything get in the way of this love! God so loved the world ... God so loves you! St. John's immortalised words bid us to love one another. Our dear Lord tells us, "A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another". And remember, LOVE NEVER DIES!

The day began with Mass for Mothering Sunday. Extra seats were put out in expectation of a large congregation and we were not disappointed. Beverley smiled broadly as she processed in with some of her friends among the clergy who were there to support her. The children were delighted to be sitting at the front waiting for their moment to distribute flowers to all the mothers present, the local scouts paraded their colours and the youth band played music that they had been working on specially for the occasion. So our young people were all well represented and will hopefully always remember this special day.

Beverley preached her final sermon, telling us about the day she first came to St John's and seeing the cracks almost left at once. She spoke very graciously about her time with us and some of the difficulties she had faced.

At the end of the service while we enjoyed coffee, tea and wine, Bob made a short speech thanking Beverley and wishing her well. She was then presented with the gift of a beautiful new stole to wear in her new parish and remember us by. She immediately put it on and modelled it for us. After that it was the turn of the many individuals who had brought gifts for her to come up and present them

Finally, we were able to move over to the vicarage for a buffet lunch and look at the presents at leisure, especially the beautiful collage of photos of just about everyone! Beverley will now be able to look at us all in her new home and know she will remain in our thoughts and prayers.

We thank God for bringing Beverley to us.

Bishop Christopher will preside and preach at this service and we will follow the service with a reception and lunch, hopefully, if weather allows, in the garden.

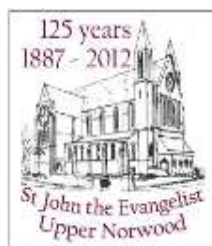

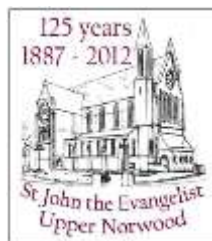

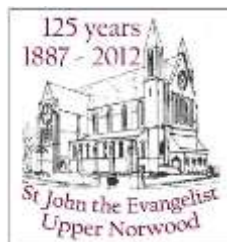

125 EVENT:
VISIT TO LAMBETH PALACE
FRIDAY 25TH MAY 2012

We have been invited to visit Lambeth Palace, the London home of the Archbishop of Canterbury, as a parish group on Friday 25th May 2012.

The Palace serves as a venue for hospitality and events for the Church of England. Within the grounds of Lambeth Palace is located the Lambeth Palace Library, with its notable store of ecclesiastical documents covering- alongside the records of the Church of England- the archive of former Archbishops of Canterbury.

Our accompanied tour of the Palace will last upwards of one and a half hours and will start at 11.00am. It will include all of the **Archbishop of Canterbury's State Rooms, the Chapel, Atrium and Crypt.**

If the weather is good the tour will also include a visit to the gardens. The gardens, much restored during Archbishop Robert **Runcie's time, are only very occasionally open to the public,**

The cost of the visit is £10.00 per person. Our party is limited to 50 places and numbers must be confirmed and the fees paid by the 30th April 2012.

While we are at the Lambeth there will be an opportunity to visit the exhibition in the Great Hall celebrating the religious life of the monarchy in an exhibition marking the Diamond Jubilee of Queen Elizabeth II and the 350th anniversary of the revised Book of Common Prayer. This exhibition charts the relationship between Crown and Church and its embodiment in the history of the Book of Common Prayer, one of the most important books in the English language.

Tickets priced at £12 for adults and £10 concession (under 17's free entry) will have to be booked separately

Lambeth Palace is easily accessible, situated at the southern end of Lambeth Bridge: the number 3 bus from Crystal Palace passes the door as does the 507 which serves Waterloo and Victoria stations

Light lunches can be obtained from the cafe in the Garden Museum, located next to the Palace.

A booking form for the visit will be available towards the end of March and places will be filled on a first come first served basis.

Were any members of our party interested to stay on to attend evensong at Westminster Abbey, which is sung at 5.00pm it may be possible to secure a number of reserved seats in the Quire.



JENNY'S CORNER – SUSSEX DOWNS April 2012



On 23 February the Royal Mail issued a set of first class stamps ‘Britons of Distinction’ and, looking at the notes in the presentation pack on the Quaker Joan Mary Fry, I was inspired by the wonderful work she accomplished in her life time. I had heard of Elizabeth Fry (portrayed on the back of the £5 note) but was not aware of the wonderful work that Joan Mary Fry achieved with others who lived during the same period.

Running through it all is the need for penal reform. Today there are many who, through organizations such as Human Writes, Amnesty International and the church, are still striving to achieve justice and understanding in the treatment of prisoners.

THE CHOIR GO TO THE ISLE OF MAN

Those of us who were at St John's in the 1970s will not have forgotten Fr Whitworth. Fr Duncan, as he was known, came to St John's to serve his second curacy, in the days when young priests were expected to serve a full term of at least 3 years in two different parishes before contemplating taking a parish of their own. Fr Duncan was a young man full of vitality and zeal for his calling and many things around St John's remain as a testament to this enthusiasm and energy. Most notably the small room where the Sunday School meet, which was called the Walsingham Chapel, Fr Duncan built single-handedly as a chapel for use in the winter in the days when the ageing boiler used oil at a rate not far short of a days global production and therefore was only lit on the coldest of winter Sundays.

After leaving St John's Fr Duncan went to be assistant chaplain at the British Embassy in Madrid and for a short while at the embassy in Ankara in Turkey. On his return to British soil he accepted the living at St Matthew's Church, Douglas in the Isle of Man where he has been Vicar for over twenty years. He retires in July.

It has often been talked about but never undertaken to have a choir trip to the island to sing at St Matthew's, which incidentally is another Pearson church, the last, I believe before Pearson's death. The choir is, at last, going to sing the first weekend in May; Evensong on Saturday 5th and the High Mass on Sunday 6th. It is a number years since the choir have been away and it seemed appropriate to do so at Fr Duncan's church before he retires. Some of the choir remember him as a curate at St John's. Some of us know the Isle of Man well. I know he and his congregation will give us a very warm welcome and not only will we have the pleasure of singing at his Church but we shall enjoy some time touring this small but interesting and attractive island.

Congratulations to the Youth Band on their performances on Beverley's last Sunday at St John's. They worked very hard for this occasion and showed themselves a committed group of young people. They plan to continue as a group and deserve the support of everyone at St John's.
