

## **Will of George Twyman**

**Transcribed from PROB/11/2115 188 by Simon J. Golding, October 2008**

This is the last Will and Testament of me George Twyman of the City of Winchester Gentleman. After payment of my debts and funeral expenses and all costs [pursuant] to my Will I give all my [coal] and personal estate and effects to my five children [Henry] Twyman, Edward Twyman, Emily Twyman, John Twyman and Anne Caroline Twyman equally share and share alike to and for the use of themselves, their heirs, executors and administrators respectively. I appoint my cousin Carolina Garland Twyman and my son [Henry] and my daughter Emily to be my Executors. I appoint the said Carolina Garland Twyman and my brothers Thomas Twyman and Frederick Twyman guardians of my said children during their respective periods of minority rents and profits and income of all my said [coal] and personal estate to be applied towards the maintenance and education of my said children respectively at the discretion of my said guardians until the youngest of them shall attain the age of twenty one years. I give, devise and bequeath unto George Twyman Porter all with trust estates as may be vested in me at the time of my decease to be held [antiqued] and executed and disposed of by the said George Twyman Porter according to the rules of Law and Equity and I hereby revoke all former and other wills and declare this only to be my last Will and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereby set my hand and soul in the presence of the witness hereunder mentioned this seventeenth day of June one thousand eight hundred and forty six.

[the mark of George Twyman] signed sealed and published by the said George Twyman the Estator as and for his last Will and Testament in the presence of us who in his presence and at his request and in the presence of each other have hereunto set our names as witnesses there of.

Proved at London 15<sup>th</sup> June 1850 before the Worshipful Alfred Waddilove Doctor of Laws and Surrogate to the of [Henry] Twyman Esquire the son of the Executor to whom Admon was granted having been first sworn only to administer. Power reserved of making the like grant to Caroline Garland Twyman spinster and Emily Twyman spinster the daughter of the other Executor when they shall apply for the same.

Proved at London 15<sup>th</sup> March 1895 by the oath of Emily Porter (wife of George Twyman Porter) formerly Twyman spinster the daughter of the surviving executor to whom Admon was granted. Power reserved of making the like grant to Caroline Garland Twyman spinster the daughter of the other surviving executor.
