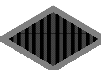
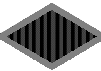

General Information

Please arrive promptly for games. See fixtures.

Please note that AENA dress code is enforced. This is shirt/skirt/socks and bibs only.

The wearing of tracksuit bottoms will be allowed as long as they are the same colour as the skirt (which must still be worn). This ruling has changed only for the Summer season due to the adverse weather conditions whilst playing outside. A fine of £5 will be made to any team not abiding to this rule.

The Committee would like to remind clubs that 'derogatory comments' made about the umpiring on the sideline will be dealt with according to the new rules, ie a penalty pass or shot may be given to the opposition.

The umpires match fees is £3.50 per match only for the Summer and £ 2.50 per match only for the Winter.

Please note at the top of the fixtures list the times are listed when umpires should be umpiring. Ensure that you supply your umpires with this information. An umpire may only umpire a maximum of 2 matches if she has NOT played. An umpiring telephone list is attached for your information. Please organise your own replacements if required. Remember - if an umpire fails to turn up to umpire a match a £10 fine plus loss of three points is deducted from her team.

If any team needs to contact any member of the Committee would you please do so at a reasonable time of night ie. **no later than 9.00 pm.**

Directions to BIRCHWOOD High School (Winter)

FROM THE M62 (towards Manchester)

Come off at Junction 11. Follow the A574 sign.

At the 1st roundabout, go straight across.

At the 2nd roundabout, turn left.

At the 3rd roundabout (BP garage on left), turn right.

At the next roundabout, go straight across.

Take the next left turning.

The Birchwood Shopping precinct is on your right.

The Birchwood tennis centre, then the school and then the new building are on your left.

FROM THE M6

Join the M62 (going towards Manchester) at Warrington and follow the above

FROM THE M56

Join the M6 at Thelwall, follow M6 North for 2 junctions, then follow the M62 (going towards Manchester). Junction 11 is the next junction.

Directions to Sankey Sports Centre (Summer)

This school is located in Sankey, Warrington. Travelling from out of town (South of Warrington / Manchester / Wigan) - take M62 leave at Junction 9, signed A49 to Warrington.

Follow A49 toward Warrington. Turn right towards Gemini (Ikea) at island. Go straight across 3 islands, turn right at next island.

Go across next 2 islands. And turn right at next island. Go across next island and turn left at next, Sports Centre is to your right.

For those travelling out of town, (Liverpool) - take M62 leave at Junction 7, A57 towards Warrington.

Follow A57 towards Warrington. Go through a set of lights. Travel for approx 3 miles and turn left at the next lights (Pub on left). Go across 1st island and turn right at next two islands. Sports centre is on the right.

WHAT TO DO IF.....

1. You need to cancel a match -

Contact the fixture secretary who will give you the following telephone numbers for you to contact:

- the opposition
- the teams who are umpiring

If you do NOT contact the fixtures secretary in time, you will be fined. If you cannot contact the fixture secretary directly, leave a message.

2. You need an umpire -

You will be issued with a list of umpires registered to our League at the start of the season. It is your responsibility to contact a suitably qualified replacement if you need one. After attempting to get an volunteer you need further assistance, then you can contact the umpiring secretary.

3. You need to re-arrange a match -

The league fixtures are arranged around the time slots available from the venues we use and the light available in the Summer and as such the league is unable to re-arrange any matches.

4. You are the home team on the fixture -

it is your team's responsibility to ensure that the score card is completed with team names, **player of season**, AENA team numbers, umpires and teams rep signatures and match date. Put this card plus the umpires score cards into the box within 10 minutes of the game finishing. Fines are applicable for not fully completing the card and / or not in the box on time.

5. Run out of score cards -

Contact the secretary who will get some posted out to you.

6. You need to affiliate a new player with the W&DNL -

To affiliate a player mid season, complete the Affiliation form received in your start-up pack and post this to the Affiliations secretary for receipt by Monday of that week. Or call the Affiliations secretary by the Monday, providing the name of player and team to affiliate to, and provide paperwork on the Wednesday. Dont forget to supply the registration fee.

Part 2 must be signed by Andrea Burgess **BEFORE** the player is allowed to play for the above team. Part 1 will be sent back to the club to acknowledge affiliation.

7. You need to affiliate your team to AENA -

After a new team has played for 12 months in the W&DNL, they must affiliate their players to AENA before they can continue to take part in the League. Information regarding the AENA is later in this booklet. In the first instance, contact AENA and they will send you the necessary form.

At the start of every Winter season, the Warrington League requires that you affiliate by the end of October each year. All player in the W&DNL winter season must be affiliated to AENA unless they play less than 4 games in the season. If you need to affiliate a player mid-season, contact the Cheshire Affiliation secretary.

8. The team is fined and you wish to query it -

The fines detailed above are applicable in the W&DNL and are upheld throughout. If you are fined, a form with a reference number, date and detail of fine will be sent to you. You have 28 days to pay the fine. If you wish to query the fine, you have 14 days to appeal in writing to the Fines Secretary from the date on the fine. At this point, the committee will discuss your appeal and a reply sent as soon as practically possible. Please note - the fines have been put into place due to situations arising throughout the years in order to provide a smooth-run league for all. Some fines also have loss of points.

9. A player changes her name mid-season -

If a player has a name change mid-season which you plan to use on the score cards, please inform the affiliation secretary before she plays and you use her new name. Writing the incorrect name on the card will mean a fine and potentially loss of points. You have been warned.

10. A player wants to become a scorer or umpire -

The W&DNL is committed to improving the standard of Umpiring in our league. As such, any person wishing to become a scorer for 1st and 2nd Divisional games and/or train to become an umpire, contact the Umpiring secretary who will be organising courses throughout the year.

11. You want a copy of the AENA Rule Book -

CONSTITUTION

1. The League shall be called the Warrington and District Netball League.
2. The aim of the League shall be the encouragement and promotion of the game of netball in the area.
3.
 - (i) Membership of the League shall be open to all organisations and individuals as the Committee may approve and on payment of the appropriate affiliation fees.
 - (ii) New Clubs not affiliated to AENA may be accepted by the League for not more than one full season.
 - (iii) AENA affiliated clubs must be able to produce AENA affiliation cards or numbers for every individual player listed on their W & D N L affiliation form if requested to do so. Failure to do so will be deemed an infringement of byelaw 4.
 - (iv) School Clubs are exempt from this ruling if their school is affiliated to the English Schools Netball Association.
 - (v) Affiliated members shall be bound by the rules of AENA and the rules governing play shall be those currently issued by AENA.
4.
 - (i) The business of the League shall be controlled by an Executive Committee consisting of a Chairperson, Vice-Chairperson, Secretary, Treasurer, Fixtures Secretary, Fines Secretary, Umpire Secretary, Affiliations Secretary and five other officers
 - (ii) All Officers shall be elected annually at the Annual General Meeting. Retiring Officers are eligible for re-election.
 - (iii) Each nomination for office shall have a proposer and seconder and the sanction of the nominee shall have to be obtained.
 - (iv) Casual vacancies amongst officers shall be filled at the discretion of the Executive Committee and shall remain in force until the next A.G.M.
5.
 - (i) The A.G.M. shall be held in the week following the

conclusion of the Winter Season.

- (ii) League meetings shall be held as and when required.
 - (iii) Fourteen days notice in writing shall be given of a League meeting and shall be accompanied by an agenda and other relevant notices.
- 6.
- (i) Representatives from each affiliated Club shall attend all League meetings in the ratio of one representative per team and each representative shall be entitled to one vote. Any Club not represented shall be fined at the current rate.
 - (ii) Any other member of an affiliated Club may attend meetings and take part in discussions at the discretion of the Committee but shall not be allowed to vote.
 - (iii) Each officer of the Executive Committee shall be entitled to one vote and the Chairperson shall have the casting vote at all meetings.
- 7.
- (i) Alterations to the Constitution shall only be made at the A.G.M. and shall be carried by a two thirds majority of those entitled to vote.
 - (ii) Alterations to the Byelaws shall be made at any League meeting and shall be carried by a two thirds majority of those entitled to vote.
- 8.
- (i) The Executive Committee shall accept no responsibility for loss of or damage to personal property of affiliated members.
 - (ii) The Executive Committee shall accept no responsibility for any accident to or injury sustained by affiliated members.
9. The Executive Committee shall have the power to deal with any other relevant matter not specifically covered by the Constitution or its Byelaws.

BYELAWS

1. A player may affiliate to only one League Club.
2. A player may transfer clubs but shall complete the appropriate form, pay the required fee and receive written acknowledgement from a Committee member before playing for a new club.
3. A player may play for any team within her club but may only play one game per match night.
4. The fielding of non-affiliated/ineligible players will incur the loss of 3 points (irrespective of the result) and a fine at the current rate.
5. If a club fails to gain entry into the league in a season which they have previously played, and successfully enters the following year, then that team must start in the lowest division of that particular season. However should a natural gap appear within another division (providing it is lower than the one the team previously exited) then they could be slotted into that position.
6. The poaching of players shall not be allowed and any such action shall be referred to the executive committee for their attention.
7.
 - (i) In the event of disputes/complaints, the Club Secretary shall notify the League Secretary in writing in addition to making a relevant comment on the score card.
 - (ii) Affiliated members have a right of appeal which may be exercised in writing to the League Secretary.
 - (iii) In accordance with AENA rules, no player, other than a team captain, may approach an umpire for clarification of the rules, and such approaches may only be made during an interval or at full time.
8.
 - (i) The dates and duration of matches shall be determined by the executive committee.
 - (ii) Matches shall be played on the date and at the time stated on the fixture list, unless at least two committee members consider the pitch/pitches unplayable. **Failure to comply** : points awarded to the non-offending team on application to the Fixture Secretary
 - (iii) Notice of cancellation by a team unable to fulfil a fixture shall be made to the Fixtures Secretary and shall be at least 24 hours in advance. **Failure to comply** - a fine at

the current rate.

- (iv) Central timing shall be used but all matches shall start and finish on the umpire's whistle.
 - (v) Regulation bibs shall be worn by all team players.
Failure to comply - a fine at the current rate.
 - (vi) All jewellery shall be removed except wedding rings which must be taped. **Failure to comply** - a fine at the current rate.
 - (vii) The home team shall be responsible for the full completion and posting of the result card. **Failure to comply** - a fine at the current rate.
8. (i) League positions shall be determined on the basis of:-

- (ii) Goal difference shall be taken into account where necessary. For each game where points have been claimed, a team's average goal difference shall be added to their total goal difference.
9. (i) Any team which owes monies to the League two weeks following the last game of the season shall not be eligible to join in the forthcoming season.
- (ii) Any fine not paid within 4 weeks from the date of issue will be increased by 50% and the team will be automatically responsible for the new account.

INSTRUCTIONS

Please read carefully before completing the Membership Application/Renewal (MAR) Form.

- 1 The Affiliation year runs from 1st September to 31st August.
- 2 Membership fees are payable on and from 1st September and must be paid no later than 31st December (to be eligible to vote at the AGM)
- 3 Additional members must be registered by sending their details and appropriate fees to the County Treasurer who will issue additional individual registration cards.
- 4 No players may be considered for trials, no individual may attend courses or take awards, and no team may enter tournaments until their current membership fees have been paid and current membership number issued.
- 5 All Clubs will receive copies of the National "Netball" Quarterly Magazine on receipt of affiliation fees at the AENA office.
- 6 There is no longer a 2nd Claim Fee payable to the AENA. Any individual may register with more than one club paying her AENA affiliation fee through only one which is then considered to be her First Claim Club. Please asterisk against name when registering as a second claim player and indicate First Claim Club in the appropriate column. No further fee is required although Counties may apply a levy if they so wish.
- 7 All three completed copies of the MAR Form (and continuation sheets if used) should be sent, together with the appropriate remittance, to your County Treasurer. The bottom copy will be returned to you with your Membership and Registration Cards.
- 8 Upon receipt of the items detailed in 7 your County Treasurer will issue:-
- 9 your Membership Card
- 10 a Registration Card for each registered participant.

Club Secretaries should issue Registration cards to their rightful holders as soon as possible, ensuring that they bear the appropriate 'unique' number, i.e.Club Number > L1000/27 < Individual's number on MAR Form or Supplementary.

- 11 Please give date of birth of any participant Under 23.
- 12 Please indicate Under 16 (midnight 31st August/1st September) players by marking (J) adjacent to names and add date of birth in the appropriate column.
- 13 Please indicate any Netball qualifications held by indicating C (coaching), U (umpiring), L (leaders award) in the appropriate column.
- 14 A small premium has been included in the Fees to enable the Association to provide Civil Products Liability cover to all members. This cover is compulsory. It is not however Personal Accident cover and Clubs are advised to take advantage of the Personal Accident Insurance package available through Perkins Slade (further information from AENA Office).



**WARRINGTON AND DISTRICT NETBALL LEAGUE
CODE OF PRACTISE FOR PLAYERS**

FOR THE ATTENTION OF ALL

- Nails must be kept short. Bitten nails are dangerous. All jewellery must be removed, including nose studs, brow rings and earrings. Only a wedding ring may be worn but taped.
- No alcohol must be taken before or during the game.
- There shall be no biting, kicking, thumping or swearing on court. The use of the four lettered words (with or without 'ing') will not be tolerated and a free pass awarded to the other team should any player continue to swear. Umpires to be notified if opposing players are offended by repeated use of bad language. Biting, kicking or thumping will be considered fighting - even if it is spontaneous - and the offending player(s) will be suspended without a warning.
- Two umpires will be in control of the game and the decision of the umpire shall be final and given without appeal. If a player becomes in dispute with an umpire, the umpire may choose to penalise with whatever action is considered appropriate under the rules of the game i.e. free pass, penalty pass/shot, free pass up court, with a warning that the player will be suspended with continued disputes.
- A player may be suspended from a game for a specified period, except in extreme circumstances, after an appropriate warning has been given. **A minimum penalty period is 2 goals scored.**
- The suspended player shall remain off court until allowed to resume play by the umpire.
- In the case of more serious misconduct or misconduct following a suspension, the umpire may order a player to leave court and take no further part in the game. This action shall only be taken when the ordinary penalty is considered insufficient and except in extreme cases, only after a

Procedure 'Complaints against Players'

Appendix to Byelaw 7 (i.)

1. Should any team or player wish to complain about any aspect of the match, a brief written comment is to be put on the match card. If the team wish to take this further then a letter must be sent to the League Secretary only.
2. The Umpiring Secretary will be informed (by the Fines/Fixtures Secretary who reviews the cards on a weekly basis) of the comment on the match card.
3. Should teams wish to follow up a comment on the match card, a letter addressed to the League Secretary only, must be received within 7 days of the game. This is to be from either the team captain or club secretary and must contain specific details of the nature of the alleged incident, names of player(s) involved from both teams and the specific issue/complaint which the committee are being asked to investigate.
4. On receipt of a letter of complaint, the League Secretary will ask the Umpiring Secretary to contact the umpires concerned and will ask the Club Secretary of the other teams for their written comments on the match, to be returned within 7 days of the request.
5. The committee is to convene every 4 weeks during the season (if required) to specifically discuss any such issues.
6. Following investigation and discussion the committee will write to both teams and both umpires concerned and inform them of any decisions and/or necessary action.
7. It is appreciated that letters detailing incidents will vary in nature but a three-tier system of sanctions will apply. In the first instance the committee will either take no further action and inform teams of this decision or issue an informal request that either team or named individual(s) play in a sporting manner throughout the game.
8. Should a second complaint be upheld by the committee, then a formal written warning will be given to either the team or named individual(s).
9. In the unfortunate circumstance of a third complaint being upheld then the team or named individual(s) will receive an automatic 2 match ban (excluding byes and holidays).
10. Both the League and Affiliations Secretaries will keep a record of the upheld complaints and any subsequent banned players. Any sanctions are valid in all the seasons in which the players participate.
11. Should a banned individual play then the fines system for non-affiliated players apply.
12. Should a team be banned then they will automatically forfeit the match and the full points awarded to their opponents.

UMPIRING STANDARDS

It is important that teams know, understand and recognise the different levels of umpires. There are five levels starting with a beginner through to an international.

Below is listed the requirements of each umpiring standard and we hope that by reading this, no one in your team will criticise umpires decisions again.

The Policy of W&DNL has been to introduce new umpires as Beginners and allow them to umpire at their level for a winter and summer season. Then they attend a C award course and are tested in that following summer season.

This is a summary of what is expected from each level:

Beginner - Only expected to see:

Three running steps for foot fault

Obstruction ie lessening of 3 ft at a slow or stopped situation

Contact ie knocking, pushing, tripping, maybe ball out of hands

Any more than the above is expecting too much.

C Award - Expected to see all above plus

Dragging of the landing foot for foot fault.

Obstruction ie see obstruction before the defender is the correct distance.

Contact ie taking the ball out of hands.

The above observations are where the ball is.

B Award - All the above plus

Hops for foot fault

Obstruction ie falling in and judge whether that movement has impeded the player with the ball.

Contact ie to see that start of contact and not the end product (such as contact on a player that sends her off-side).

Too many umpires will penalise the off-side rather than the obstruction.

A B award umpire must be able to hold concentration for an hours game and be aware of off the ball situations within the peripheral vision around the ball. Obvious advantage must be played but signalled and shouted so players are aware of it.

Only captains may approach an umpire for clarification of a rule. Disputes regarding scores must be looked at and dealt with by the umpires immediately. If disputes cannot be resolved, the Umpiring Secretary must be informed.

Qualified umpires should provide beginner umpires with encouragement and construction observational advise.
